On the other hand, globalization is associated with increasing mutual economic dependence of all countries in the world as a global trend and quality in world economic development.

10. Purposes of the curriculum (competencies):

To understand the logic of the functioning of contemporary labor markets on the basis of standard and new theoretical approaches in this area (the classical model for the functioning of the labor market and its balance, the Phillips curve in the short and long term, the new Keynesians elaborations and labor market problems), and to study modern analytical instruments in this area (Okun's law, the natural rate of unemployment i.e. NAIRU concept etc..);

To examine the important features of the labor market in the EU - in individual countries and at the EU level, the reasons for the existing rigidities and relatively high unemployment rates in the EU Member States, to make comparisons with the labor market in the U.S. and elaborate social policy of the EU, its specifics in individual countries and the obligations of the Member States in this field on the basis of a common policy;

To extract relevant experiences and lessons for Macedonia, as in the domain of the function and regulation of the labor market and in the field of social policy.

11. Content of the course program:

Curriculum in this discipline elaborate the problems related to the functioning of the labor market, the reasons for rigidity wages (social transfers, minimum wage, unions, new approaches in this domain - pay for performance, insiders and outsiders, the phenomenon hysteresis and etc.) and the consequences that they cause - periods of persistent unemployment. Problems of unemployment and labor market functioning in Macedonia are also part of teaching content in this subject. The course also elaborate social policy in general and especially in the EU member states - its genesis, change and development, especially in terms of issues related to the EU enlargement.
