This section covers the recruitment and career advancement, remuneration, social advantages and future prospects of public officials in several European countries comparatively. Also, here are placed and different understandings of the relationship of public servants to politics, or their depoliticization and professionalization. This course will provide students with understanding of the rights, obligations and responsibilities of the civil servants in the Republic of Macedonia, rewards, punishment, training and other rights and obligations of employment.

This course offers comprehensive education and the acquisition of basic knowledge about conceptual and terminological determination clerical status and the clerical system in the Republic of Macedonia and the legal basis for the existence of the clerical system in the Republic of Macedonia. Also covered is the legal regulation of the status of civil servants in the Republic of Macedonia, the system of titles and groups of civil servants. Principles of selection of personnel in the public service: spoils and merit system, the rights and duties of civil servants, promotion and reward system of salaries and allowances of civil servants. Additionally included is the responsibility and evaluation of civil servants. This context contains grounds for dismissal from the clerical, legal protection of the rights of civil servants, the register of civil servants, editing status rights and duties of civil servants in the Republic of Macedonia.
