NOTES:

The University organizes first-cycle instruction at the relevant units outside its headquarters, at the location where enrollment takes place, until the diploma for the 180 credits earned is awarded. The University reserves the right, in certain cases, to organize instruction for the additional 60 credits of the first study cycle at the headquarters of the unit, for the purpose of awarding the first-cycle diploma.

If fewer than 20 students enroll in a given study program at a unit, Goce Delcev University reserves the right to assign the student to the home faculty, or the student may choose another active study program with available places. An exception applies to study programs for which the Call for Applications has set a quota of fewer than 20 students.

II. Conditions and criteria for enrollment

Candidates who have completed four-year secondary education are entitled to enroll in the first cycle of university and professional studies, namely:

- candidates who completed secondary education in the 2025/2026 academic year **with a state matura, a state vocational matura, or a state arts matura**;
- candidates who completed secondary education after the 2020/2021 academic year **with a state matura**;
- candidates who completed secondary education in the 2019/2020 academic year **without a state matura**;
- candidates **who completed a state matura** before the 2019/2020 academic year;
- candidates **who completed secondary education before the 2007/2008 academic year and did not sit the state matura**; and
- candidates who completed four-year secondary education **(with a completed International Baccalaureate)**.

When registering for enrollment at Goce Delcev University in Stip, candidates may, in the online application, selectively indicate up to three priority choices of study programs from different units within the University.

Example:

1. State quota, Faculty A
2. Co-financing, Faculty A
3. State quota, Faculty B

Candidates are enrolled as full-time state-financed students and as full-time co-financing students.

Part-time students may also be enrolled in the first cycle of studies, where the nature of the study program allows it.

The method of selection and ranking of candidates will be carried out depending on the type of study programs for which they are applying, namely:

- a) for study programs without an assessment of candidates' knowledge and skills, where selection is based solely on secondary-school performance (secondary-school performance for candidates without a matura, or secondary-school performance

combined with matura results for candidates who have passed the matura), which accounts for 100%, i.e. a maximum of 100 points may be obtained on this basis; and

- b) for study programs with an assessment of candidates' knowledge and skills, where selection is based on secondary-school performance (secondary-school performance for candidates without a matura, or secondary-school performance combined with matura results for candidates who have passed the matura), which accounts for 40% (40 points), and on the results of the assessment of the candidate's knowledge and skills, which accounts for 60% (60 points);

A list of the study programs for which candidates' knowledge and skills are assessed is provided at the end of this Call for Applications (**List 1**).

- c) As of the 2026/2027 academic year, depending on the type of matura the candidates have passed, candidates may choose study programs in accordance with the notice published on 25 December 2025, available at the following link:

The primary criterion for the selection and ranking of candidates for enrollment in undergraduate studies is the performance achieved in secondary education. Depending on the type of study program, an additional selection criterion is the assessment of candidates' knowledge and skills.

The evaluation of candidates' performance is expressed in points. Candidates may earn a maximum of **100 points, or 40 points** for those subject to the assessment of knowledge and skills.

Additional criteria for the General Medicine study program

Pursuant to Decision No. 2002-167/67 of 07.06.2022 of the Teaching and Scientific Council of the Faculty of Medical Sciences, the following criteria are defined for the enrollment of students in the **General Medicine** study program:

- During the enrollment periods, only applications from candidates with **at least 80 points on all bases combined** (performance over the four years of completed secondary education and matura results) will be accepted;
- The same criteria apply to foreign students.

Additional criteria for the study programs in General Medicine, Dental Medicine, and Pharmacy

- For the Faculty of Medical Sciences, criteria are defined for the enrollment of candidates who do not hold a state matura, for the study programs of General Medicine, Dental Medicine, and Pharmacy in the Macedonian language, for the 2026/27 academic year, as follows:

- An entrance examination in the subjects Chemistry and Biology is administered (during the enrollment periods);
 - Ranking takes into account the points earned from performance over the four years of secondary education (maximum 60 points) and the points earned in the entrance examination in Chemistry and Biology (maximum 40 points), based on 40 questions per subject, with each question worth 0.5 points – a maximum of 40 points in total.
1. **Study programs without an assessment of candidates' knowledge and skills, where selection is based solely on secondary-school performance**

1. **State matura**

1. Secondary-school performance

All grades entered in the certificates (transcripts) for all years are added together, the resulting sum is divided by the number of grades, and the resulting grade-point average is multiplied by **12**. On this basis, a maximum of **60 points** may be obtained.

grade-point average x 12 = maximum 60 points

(example with an average of 5.00: 5 x 12 = 60 points)

2. Performance achieved on the state matura

For each external subject (**E1** and **E2**), the candidate's percentile rank (expressed as a percentage) divided by 20 is added to the grade. On this basis, a maximum of **20 points** may be obtained for the external subjects (**a**).

The grades from the internal subjects are added together after being multiplied by a factor of 1.6. On this basis, a maximum of 16 points may be obtained (**b**).

The grade obtained on the **project assignment (P)** is multiplied by a **coefficient of 0.8**. On this basis, a maximum of **4 points (c)** may be obtained.

(a) = (E1 + PR1/20) + (E2 + PR2/20) = maximum 20 points

(b) = I1x1.6 + I2x1.6 = maximum 16 points

(c) = P x 0.8 = maximum 4 points

The total result of the state matura can yield a maximum of **40 points (a+b+c)**.

2. **Without a matura**

For study programs where selection is based **solely on secondary-school performance (candidates without a matura)**, points are awarded as follows:

1. Secondary-school performance

All grades entered in the certificates for all years are added together, the resulting sum is divided by the number of grades, and the resulting grade-point average is multiplied by **20**. On this basis, a maximum of **100 points** may be obtained.

grade-point average x 20 = maximum 100 points

(example with an average of 5.00: 5 x 20 = 100 points)

3. International Baccalaureate

1. Secondary-school performance

Points are awarded as follows: all grades entered in the certificates for all years are added together, the resulting sum is divided by the number of grades, and the resulting grade-point average is multiplied by **12**. On this basis, a maximum of **60 points** may be obtained.

grade-point average x 12 = maximum 60 points

(example with an average of 5.00: $5 \times 12 = 60$ points)

2. Performance achieved on the International Baccalaureate

Each grade from the six subjects taken as part of the International Baccalaureate is multiplied by a **coefficient of 1.2**. The resulting values are added together. On this basis, a maximum of **36 points** (b) may be obtained.

The grade obtained on the extended essay is multiplied by a **coefficient of 0.8**. On this basis, a maximum of **4 points** (c) may be obtained.

The total result of the International Baccalaureate can yield a maximum of **40 points**.

$a1 = \text{subject 1} \times 1.2 = \text{maximum 6 points}$

$a2 = \text{subject 2} \times 1.2 = \text{maximum 6 points}$

$a3 = \text{subject 3} \times 1.2 = \text{maximum 6 points}$

$a4 = \text{subject 4} \times 1.2 = \text{maximum 6 points}$

$a5 = \text{subject 5} \times 1.2 = \text{maximum 6 points}$

$a6 = \text{subject 6} \times 1.2 = \text{maximum 6 points}$

b = sum of a1 + a2 + ... a6 = maximum 36 points

c = extended essay x 0.8 = maximum 4 points

b+c = maximum 40 points

(example with an average of 5.00:

$(5 \times 1.6) + (5 \times 1.6) + (5 \times 1.6) + (5 \times 1.6) + (5 \times 1.6) + (5 \times 1.6) + (5 \times 0.8) = 40$ points)

2. Study programs with an assessment of candidates' knowledge and skills, where selection is based on secondary-school performance (candidates with or without a matura) and the assessment of the candidate's knowledge and skills

For faculties where an assessment of knowledge and skills is carried out, the points from secondary-school performance (with or without a matura) are obtained as described under point 1. The resulting total is then multiplied by a **coefficient of 0.4**. On this basis, a maximum of 40 points may be obtained.

The points from the assessment of candidates' knowledge and skills are calculated as follows:

For study programs with particular specific requirements, candidate selection is based on secondary-school performance, which accounts for 40%, and on the assessment of candidates' knowledge and skills, which accounts for 60%.

The assessment of candidates' knowledge and skills is scored from 0 to 60 points. The assessment is eliminatory in nature. Candidates who fail to obtain at least 10 points are not ranked.

Candidates are ranked by adding together the points obtained on both bases.

The assessment of knowledge and skills will be carried out at the following faculties:

- A. Academy of Music
- B. Academy of Fine Arts
- C. Film Academy
- D. Faculty of Educational Sciences
- E. Faculty of Medical Sciences

The study programs for which the assessment of knowledge and skills is carried out are given in the annex to the Call for Applications (List 1).

III. Selection of candidates

1. For the implementation of the enrollment Call for Applications, Goce Delcev University - Stip forms enrollment committees for each unit. At the **Academy of Music, Film Academy, Academy of Fine Arts, and Faculty of Medical Sciences**, a Committee for the Assessment of Candidates' Knowledge and Skills is formed. At the **Faculty of Educational Sciences**, a Committee for the Assessment of Psychophysical Abilities is formed.
2. The implementation of the Call for Applications is overseen by the University Enrollment Committee, which ensures consistent compliance with the provisions of the Call, provides guidance and opinions during its implementation, decides on objections to the preliminary ranking list, and issues the admission decision.
3. The ranking of candidates is carried out by the University Enrollment Committee.
4. The enrollment committees publish, on the notice board and on the University's website, the points obtained from secondary education (grade-point average) and the results of the assessment of knowledge and skills for the **Academy of Music, Film Academy, Academy of Fine Arts, and Faculty of Medical Sciences**. A candidate has the right to lodge an objection with the University Enrollment Committee within 24 hours of the publication of the results. Otherwise, the candidate forfeits the right to object in subsequent proceedings concerning the published results.
5. After the enrollment committee publishes the preliminary ranking list of candidates for enrollment, a candidate has the right to lodge an objection within 24 hours. The objection may relate only to technical omissions and errors made in the calculation of points, and must be submitted to the University Enrollment Committee via a completed form to prigovori@ugd.edu.mk. Further information can be found on the University's website, in the enrollment section.

The decision of the University Enrollment Committee is final. Decisions on objections are published on the University's notice board.

Once the deadlines for submitting and resolving objections have expired, the University Enrollment Committee publishes the admission decision for students for each unit of the University separately (final ranking list), on the basis of which student enrollment is carried out.

6. Study programs with unfilled places remaining after the end of the first enrollment period will hold enrollment in a second and third enrollment period.
7. If, in the first enrollment period, at the cut-off point of the list of admitted candidates there are several candidates with an equal number of points (up to five candidates), the faculty enrolls all such candidates. If the number of such candidates exceeds five, priority is given to candidates who are winners of awards at national and international competitions in fields relevant to the respective study program.

If the same situation recurs in the second enrollment period, as many candidates are admitted as determined by the Call for Applications, with priority given to candidates who are winners of awards at national and international competitions in fields relevant to the respective study program. The type and relevance of the awards is determined by the faculty responsible for the study program.

IV. Enrollment of full-time students

8. Students in the state quota are enrolled upon payment of a fee of 200 euros, in denar equivalent at the average exchange rate of the National Bank of the RNM; students in the co-financing quota are enrolled upon payment of a co-financing fee of 400 euros, in denar equivalent at the average exchange rate of the National Bank of the RNM. Part-time students are enrolled upon payment of a fee of 400 euros, in denar equivalent at the average exchange rate of the National Bank of the RNM. Payment is made in four equal installments, at the beginning and at the end of each semester, for each year of study throughout the entire course of study.
9. **Exemption from payment of the participation fee** for studies in the first year of the 2026/2027 academic year is available to those enrolled in the first enrollment period as full-time state-quota students, ranked according to secondary-school performance of no less than 80 points, as follows:
 - **Faculty of Medical Sciences** – the top 20 ranked candidates
 - 10 in the General Medicine study program
 - 5 in the Pharmacy study program
 - 5 in the Dental Medicine study program
 - **Faculty of Computer Science** – the top 10 ranked candidates
 - **Faculty of Agriculture** – the top 10 ranked candidates
 - **Faculty of Natural and Technical Sciences** – the top 10 ranked candidates
 - **Faculty of Economics** – the top 10 ranked candidates
 - **Faculty of Law** – the top 10 ranked candidates
 - **Faculty of Tourism and Business Logistics** – the top 10 ranked candidates
 - **Faculty of Electrical Engineering** – the top 5 ranked candidates
 - **Faculty of Mechanical Engineering** – the top 5 ranked candidates

- **Faculty of Technology and Technical Sciences** – the top 5 ranked candidates
- **Faculty of Educational Sciences** – the top 5 ranked candidates
- **Academy of Music** – the top 5 ranked candidates
- **Academy of Fine Arts** – the top 2 ranked candidates
- **Film Academy** – the top 2 ranked candidates

The exemption from the participation fee does not apply to candidates who completed secondary education before the 2007/2008 academic year and did not sit the state matura.

- **Faculty of Philology**
 - All students enrolled in the first, second, and third enrollment periods as full-time state-quota students in the Macedonian Language and Literature, German Language and Literature, Turkish Language and Literature, Italian Language and Literature, and English Language and Literature study programs, as follows:
 - Macedonian Language and Literature
 - Teaching and Applied track: All enrolled students are exempt
 - Exemption from the participation fee also applies to all active students in these tracks in subsequent years of study
 - German Language and Literature
 - Teaching, and Translation and Interpreting: For the top 5 candidates per track
 - Turkish Language and Literature
 - Teaching, and Translation and Interpreting: For the top 5 candidates per track
 - Italian Language and Literature
 - Teaching and Translation and Interpreting: For the top 5 candidates
 - Translation and Interpreting: For the top 5 candidates
 - English Language and Literature
 - Teaching, and Translation and Interpreting: For the top 10 candidates per track
 - **Members of sports clubs** that are part of sports teams bearing the name of Goce Delcev University - Stip will be exempt from paying the participation fee for the first year of first-cycle studies.
10. The University will not charge a participation fee for:
- **persons without parents** under 26 years of age, if unemployed;
 - **persons with disabilities**, in accordance with the Government decree;
 - **war invalids**;
 - **persons raised in orphanages/children's homes**, if unemployed.

The participation-fee funds for these persons will be covered from the Budget of the Republic of North Macedonia.

- Students of **Roma nationality** enrolling in the 2026/2027 academic year are exempt from the participation fee for the first and second semesters, in accordance with the Government of the Republic of North Macedonia project. Remaining study costs are borne by the students.

Members of the **security forces, children of a member of the security forces killed** (in armed actions) **or deceased** (death occurring as a direct consequence of a wound or injury sustained during armed actions), as determined under Articles 2 and 4 of the Law on Special Rights of Members of the Security Forces of the Republic of North Macedonia and Members of Their Families ("Official Gazette of the SRM" No. 2/2002, 17/2003, and 30/2004, and No. 66 of 31.05.2007), will in the 2026/2027 academic year be enrolled outside the state quota, without payment of co-financing, under the enrollment conditions set out in this Call for Applications, and their number may amount to no more than 10% of the total number of students in the respective study program.

Candidates exercise the right referred to in the preceding paragraph at the time of application, by submitting a document from the Ministry of Defense or the Ministry of Internal Affairs. Subsequent submission of such a document for candidates enrolling in the first year will not be taken into account.

V. Enrollment of part-time students

11. Candidates who meet the enrollment requirements and have signed a statement specifying, under full personal responsibility, the reason for part-time study may be enrolled as part-time students.
12. Part-time students are enrolled under the same conditions and criteria as full-time students, and are ranked on a separate ranking list.

VI. Enrollment of co-financing students

13. Candidates who meet the enrollment requirements but, owing to limited quotas, cannot be enrolled in the category of state-financed students, are also enrolled at the University as full-time students in the respective study programs.
14. Students enrolled in this category pay the amount set out in Section I of the Call for Applications in denar equivalent, at the average exchange rate of the National Bank of the RNM. For students paying a co-financing fee of 400 euros, payment is made in 4 (four) equal installments, at the beginning and at the end of each semester, for each year of study throughout the entire course of study.

For all others, payment is made in two equal installments at the beginning of each semester.

15. The co-financing fee for students enrolled in the following study programs is:
 - **General Medicine in English** at the Faculty of Medical Sciences: 6,000 euros per academic year;
 - **Pharmacy in English** at the Faculty of Medical Sciences: 5,000 euros per academic year;
 - **Dental Medicine in English** at the Faculty of Medical Sciences: 5,000 euros per academic year;
 - **International Law and International Relations** (four-year studies) at the Faculty of Law: 1,500 euros per academic year;
 - **Computer Engineering and Technologies** at the Faculty of Computer Science: 2,000 euros per academic year;
 - **Business Economics** (three-year studies) at the Faculty of Economics: 1,200 euros per academic year.

16. Additional criteria for all study programs taught in English

The co-financing fee is paid in two equal installments at the beginning of each semester.

17. Additional criteria and required documents for the study programs of General Medicine in English, Dental Medicine in English, and Pharmacy in English

For the study programs **General Medicine in English, Dental Medicine in English, and Pharmacy in English**, the following documents are required:

- Application/electronic application for all enrollment periods;
- Payment of 100 euros for application;
- Documents required for the enrollment of admitted candidates **must** be translated into Macedonian and notarized:
 - CV in English and a photograph;
 - Birth certificate;
 - Photocopy of passport/ID card;
 - Secondary-school certificates and diploma;
 - Motivation letter;

Candidates who fail to submit complete documentation will not be considered for enrollment.

- For the study programs **General Medicine in English, Dental Medicine in English, and Pharmacy in English**, an entrance examination will be administered, either in person or electronically/online, in the subjects **Chemistry and Biology**, during the three scheduled enrollment periods;
 - The test in **Chemistry and Biology** consists of 60 multiple-choice questions each (one correct answer) – each question is worth 0.5 points. Maximum 100 points.
 - 30 points from the Chemistry test and 30 points from the Biology test, 60 points in total;
 - 40 points from secondary-school performance;
 - Candidates will be ranked by overall performance.
 - Enrollment of admitted candidates takes place between 15 and 30 September.
18. The list of admitted candidates in this category is determined by the University Enrollment Committee on the basis of the ranking list.
19. Upon enrollment, co-financing students conclude a contract with the faculty governing the mutual rights and obligations in carrying out the teaching and education process.

VII. Candidates who completed secondary education abroad

a) Foreign nationals

20. Foreign nationals are enrolled outside the quotas set in the Call for Applications, at **no more than 30%** of the enrollment quota for each study program taught in the Macedonian language at the University.

21. A foreign national planning to apply for study programs in the Macedonian language must attend a one-year preparatory course in the Macedonian language organized by the Institute of Languages.

The preparatory course in the Macedonian language is not mandatory for candidates from Serbia, Bulgaria, Montenegro, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, and Slovenia. These candidates must demonstrate proficiency in the Macedonian language by passing an examination at the University's Institute of Languages.

The University issues a certificate confirming that the candidate is enrolled in the preparatory course in the Macedonian language at the University.

For foreign nationals, the University's Institute of Languages organizes additional courses in Macedonian and English.

Registration for the preparatory course in Macedonian and for the courses in Macedonian and English is done online at <https://eupisi.ugd.edu.mk>.

22. Foreign nationals applying to study programs taught in English at the Academy of Music, Film Academy, and Faculty of Medical Sciences undergo an assessment of knowledge and skills.
23. The tuition fee for studies conducted in the Macedonian language for foreign full-time students in the 2026/2027 academic year is 1,000 euros (in denar equivalent) per year at all units, except at the Faculty of Medical Sciences, where the fee is 1,500 euros (in denar equivalent) per year, plus 100 euros (in denar equivalent) for laboratory costs for each year of study.
24. This category also includes candidates who are foreign nationals whose parents, or who themselves, work at diplomatic missions in the Republic of North Macedonia.

b) Emigrants and citizens of the RNM who completed their entire secondary education, or part of it, abroad

25. Candidates who are citizens of the RNM and who completed their entire secondary education abroad are enrolled outside the quota, at no more than 10% of the total number of students enrolling in the first year at the faculty level.

VIII. Additional quotas established by the Government of the RNM

26. In order to ensure fair and adequate representation of students belonging to communities that are not the majority in the Republic of North Macedonia, additional students belonging to these communities will be enrolled, whose number amounts to no more than 10% of the total number of students enrolling in the first year at the faculty level. Within this percentage, members of all communities will be represented in proportion to the percentage share of the respective community in the total population of the Republic of North Macedonia.

For study programs that, in addition to Goce Delcev University - Stip, are also offered at the University of Tetovo and at "Mother Teresa" University in Skopje, members of the Albanian community will be enrolled only within the regular quotas.

XI. Transfer from another university and change of status

A student enrolled in one study program at one of the units of the University as a full-time student may, during the course of study, change their status as follows:

- From full-time state-quota student to co-financing or part-time status, or to another study program with the same status;
- Transfer from co-financing or part-time status to the state quota is not permitted.

To transfer from another university to Goce Delcev University, the student must submit a Request, along with proof of payment of the administrative fee and payment for the purpose of transfer from another university to UGD, or direct payment in the electronic system, and submission of a Certificate of Passed Examinations. This also applies to transfers to study programs taught in English.
